Dr. Javaheripour's career spans the academic, student services and administrative services arena. Celebrating his 39th year of service in public higher education, he began his higher education career at the University of New Mexico in 1978 and his community college career at Gallup Community College in 2001, continuing at Santa Fe Community College in New Mexico, Chabot College and Victor Valley College, and Yuba College in California. He has served at policy level for the past 23 years and in executive capacities for the past 18 years. He received his bachelor of science in occupational education from Southern Illinois University, MBA from Webster University and a Doctor of Education degree from the University of New Mexico.

Dr. G.H. Javaheripour was appointed president of Yuba College in February 2015. The College provides education and training to students in a service area that covers three counties. Dr. Javaheripour has guided reaffirmation of the College's Radiologic Technology, POST, and Fire Technologies programs, in addition to the entire Yuba College's seven-year accreditation. He has stabilized the College by recruiting permanent faculty, staff and administrators, developing a barrier-free relationship that is based on shared and transparent governance principles, and encouraging an environment where risk taking and innovation are encouraged. Yuba College has reengaged with the communities it serves and has once again become a critical resource for cultural, economic and civic activities. Under his guidance, the College has reengaged with the community, public educational partners, community service organizations, the Beale Air Force Base, and cities and non-profit agencies. He has developed marketing plans and strategies to inform the community of the College's services. An Alumni and Friends association has been established to reach alumni of the past ninety graduating classes, and organized Puente and Umoja programs to support students.

In his prior assignments, he was instrumental in developing an extended education network across the United States to deliver courses and programs in thirteen states/territories from Puerto Rico to Arizona. He developed networks to deliver Bachelor and Masters' degree programs and K-12 and advanced placement classes to rural communities in New Mexico. He served as vice president of administrative services at UNM-Gallup Community College, Santa Fe Community College (SFCC), Chabot College (CA), and Victor Valley College (CA). He managed instructional programs at UNM and led the student services division at SFCC. He developed a one-stop student services operation that supports student success at SFCC.
